- 7. Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- 8. Children should not enter homes of people they do not know
- 9. Throw away anything that looks tampered with or is unwrapped
- 10. Do not eat homemade treats, unless you know the person who made them


